This is a replacement fund update to replace the version dated 02 May 2017. Changes have been made to Section 4 'How has the fund performed' to the market indices figures. This fund update was first made publicly available on 05 May 2017.

1. WHAT IS THE PURPOSE OF THIS UPDATE?

This document tells you how the QuayStreet International Equity Fund (International Equity Fund) has performed and what fees were charged. The document will help you to compare the Fund with other funds. QuayStreet Asset Management Limited has prepared this update in accordance with the Financial Markets Conduct Act 2013. This information is not audited and may be updated.

2. DESCRIPTION OF THIS FUND

An exposure to international equity markets diversifying investors away from New Zealand dollar exposures targeting a return above the performance of international share markets.

3. WHAT ARE THE RISKS OF INVESTING?

The risk indicator is rated from 1 (low) to 7 (high). The rating reflects how much the value of the fund's assets goes up and down. A higher risk generally means higher potential returns over time, but more ups and downs along the way.

RISK INDICATOR FOR THE INTERNATIONAL EQUITY FUND¹

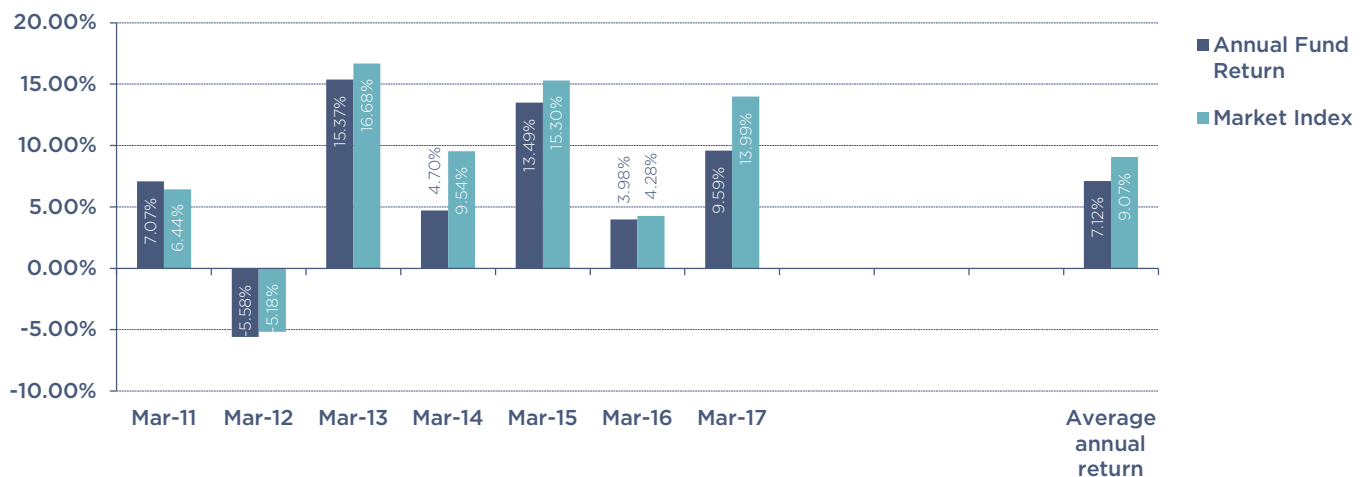

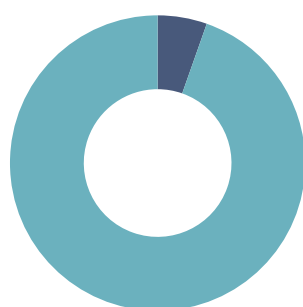
EXAMPLE OF HOW THIS APPLIES TO AN INVESTOR

Emma has \$50,000 in the Fund at the start of the year and did not make any further contributions. At the end of the year, Emma incurred a return after fund charges were deducted of \$5,595.00 (that is 11.19% of her initial \$50,000). Emma paid no other charges. This gives Emma a total return after tax of \$4,795.00 for the year.

The top 10 investments make up 96.18% of the gross asset value (adding back the value of liabilities relating to derivatives investments such as currency hedges and Total Return Swaps).

Currency hedging is material to the International Equity Fund and can range from 0 - 100% of the total foreign nominated assets.

9. NOTES

¹ In September 2014, the investment policy for the QuayStreet International Equity Fund changed. The risk indicator for this Fund is based on a combination of actual fund returns and market index returns, with market index returns being used for the period prior to 30 September 2014. Therefore the risk indicator may be a less reliable indicator of the potential future volatility of these Funds.

² Market Index returns do not reflect deductions of any fees or taxes.

³ Management fees in the QuayStreet International Equity Fund of 1.25% include Supervisor, Custody and Registry charges which are shown here as other management and administration charges. Other management and administration charges also include expenses incurred within the Fund. This percentage will change from year to year.



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
